Check-in Question:

Big Idea

During the message, we were challenged to confront the kind of pride that creeps in when we forget where our influence and resources come from. Whether you're running a business, managing a family, or just living your everyday life, we're all "3P" people to someone—carrying some combination of power, prestige, or possessions. But those things aren't badges of greatness they're reminders that we're stewards, not owners. The story of Nebuchadnezzar reminds us: we might be kings in our little worlds, but we're never The King. Pride blinds us. Humility positions us to be used by God. The quicker we remember that, the less likely we are to be ruled by ourselves.

Discussion Questions:

- Which of the 3 Ps, Power, Prestige, or Possessions, do you find most tempting to take pride in? Why do you think that particular area can so easily trip people up?
- Pride is like a remote control—if you don't grab it, it grabs you. What does that look like in your own life? When has pride grabbed the remote?
